

**Regulation on the organisation and conduct
of the admission process for bachelor's
degree study programmes**
Faculty of Sociology and Psychology
Academic year 2025-2026

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CHAPTER I

General

Article 1. This regulation establishes the framework for organizing the admission process for bachelor's degree programs at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology within the West University of Timișoara (UVT).

Article 2. Legal framework

In the academic year 2025–2026, the admission process for bachelor's degree programs at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology within the West University of Timișoara (UVT) is organized based on the provisions of the Higher Education Law no. 199/2023, with its subsequent amendments and completions, the Order of the Minister of Education no. 3693 of February 1, 2024, for the approval of the Framework Methodology regarding the organization of admission in higher education for short-term, bachelor's, master's, and doctoral study cycles, the Regulation of UVT on the organization and conduct of the admission process for bachelor's degree programs, approved by the UVT Senate, available online on the UVT admission website (www.admitere.uvt.ro), and any other national normative acts relevant to the field.

CHAPTER II

Organization of the Admission Process for Bachelor's Degree Studies within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology

Article 3.

(1) For the bachelor's degree cycle, in the academic year 2025–2026, the admission process is organized, in accordance with the legislation in force, by fields of bachelor's degree studies, for the following specializations / bachelor's degree programs authorized to operate provisionally or accredited within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology:

(2) The distribution of state-funded places by faculty is approved by the UVT Administrative Council, after the number of these places is communicated by the Ministry of Education and Research to UVT. Subsequently, the distribution of state-funded places by study programs is approved by each faculty council. After approval, the number of places allocated at the

faculty level, as well as at the level of the bachelor's degree programs, is published on the university's website dedicated to the admission process (<https://admitere.uvt.ro/procesul-de-admitere/locuri-disponibile/>).

(3) The curricula for all bachelor's degree programs for which the admission competition is organized by the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology are available online at the following address: <http://fsp.uvt.ro/programe-de-licenta/>.

Article 4. The admission process for the bachelor's degree cycle within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology is organized:

- for state-funded places (only for full-time bachelor's degree programs) through study grants;
- for tuition-based places (for both full-time and distance learning bachelor's degree programs).

Article 5.

(1) For citizens of European Union member states, the European Economic Area, and the Swiss Confederation, as well as for British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community 2019/C 384 I/01 (British citizens who are in Romania and continue to reside on Romanian territory after the end of the transition period of the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union, established under Article 126 of the withdrawal agreement as December 31, 2020, their accompanying family members or those who join them after the transition period if they held family member status before the end of the transition, as well as children born or adopted after the transition period, provided they present proof of registration from the General Inspectorate for Immigration under the Ministry of Internal Affairs), the admission process will take place under the same conditions as for Romanian citizens (provided the requirements for diploma recognition and equivalency are met).

(2) The recognition of studies completed outside Romania will be carried out by the specialized department within the Ministry of Education – the National Center for Diploma Recognition and Equivalency (CNRED) – before candidates register for the admission competition, each candidate being responsible for initiating and completing this procedure within the deadlines established by CNRED. Candidates will present the certificate or proof of recognition/equivalency of their studies at the time of registration for the admission competition, as provided in the calendar established by UVT for the admission process.

(3) High school graduates from internationally accredited education systems recognized by the Ministry of Education and Research are entitled to participate in the Romanian higher education admission process, including in the year of their high school graduation, through a conditional acceptance procedure. The admitted candidate must submit the equivalent International Baccalaureate diploma within a maximum of 6 months from the time of admission.

(4) If the admitted candidate does not submit the equivalent International Baccalaureate diploma within the term provided in paragraph (2), or if the results recorded in that document differ from the results declared by the candidate at the time of registration for the admission process, the candidate will be expelled.

(5) If, at the time of registration for the admission process, the candidate mentioned in paragraph (2) has not yet received the Baccalaureate or equivalent diploma but has taken and passed this exam or an equivalent one, the candidate must present proof of the results obtained and a sworn statement regarding the authenticity of those results and acknowledgement of the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this article.

(6) For ethnic Romanian citizens living abroad, the admission competition will be carried out according to the procedure described in Annex 3 of the Regulation of the West University of Timișoara (UVT) regarding the organization and conduct of the admission process for bachelor's degree programs, on state-funded places specially allocated for them (with or without scholarships), or on tuition-based places, in accordance with the maximum approved schooling capacity for each study program.

Article 6.

The admission process for bachelor's degree studies at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology is conducted in Romanian for all bachelor's degree programs, with the exception of the following study program:

- The Psychology – Cognitive Sciences program (in English), for which the admission process will be conducted in English.

Article 7. Admission Process Calendar

(1) The admission competition for the bachelor's degree cycle at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology is organized in two sessions, under identical conditions, before the beginning of the academic year. The second session is organized only for those study programs that have unoccupied places remaining after the first session.

(2) For the academic year 2025–2026, the admission competition calendar for the bachelor's degree cycle at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology, for Session I, in July 2025, is as follows:

- Deadline for online registration of candidates, by filling in the required information on the UVT admission platform: until 03.07.2025, at 12:00

The time and room will be posted on <http://www.fsp.uvt.ro> on 03.07.2025, at 20:00. The results of the Romanian language proficiency test will

be available in the candidate's application file on the online admission platform within 24 hours after grading.

- 07.07.2025 – UVT TEST (entry into the room between 09:00–09:40; test start time – 10:00) – Language and reasoning skills assessment test (for all study programs except PIPP). The room will be announced on <http://www.fsp.uvt.ro> on 04.07.2025, at 16:00. The test will be taken in Romanian for candidates applying to Romanian-taught bachelor's programs, and in English for those applying to the Psychology – Cognitive Sciences program (in English). The tests will be graded on the spot, in the candidate's presence. The results of the UVT Test will be available in the candidate's file on the online admission platform within 24 hours after grading opted for the evaluation of English language skills. The exact time and room will be posted on the website <http://www.fsp.uvt.ro> on 02.09.2025, at 16:00.

(6) The admission competition for the bachelor's degree cycle for foreign citizens from non-EU countries takes place until September 1, 2025, or until September 15, 2025 for students completing the Preparatory Program of Romanian Language for Foreign Citizens, who request a new Letter of Acceptance to Studies valid for the entire duration of the study cycle. Registration is done through the online admission platform for non-EU citizens: www.admiterenonue.uvt.ro (details available in Annex 4 of the Regulation of the West University of Timișoara (UVT) regarding the organization and conduct of the admission process for bachelor's degree programs).

Article 8. Admission Registration

(1) Registration for the admission competition is done personally, exclusively online, based on the identity card/passport, personal identification data, and other information required by the registration form available on the admission platform (<https://admitereonline.uvt.ro/>).

Candidates express their preferences in order for the study programs through the online admission platform.

Registration for the admission competition can also be carried out on behalf of the candidate by another person, based on a power of attorney, which will be uploaded on the admission platform in the section dedicated to required documents and certified as a true copy by UVT operators, in accordance with paragraph (5) of this article.

(2) The West University of Timișoara starts the online registration process for candidates for the admission competition beginning in May, via the admission platform (<https://admitereonline.uvt.ro/>), in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1).

(3) Once the online registration process is initiated by a candidate—by creating an account on the platform and entering personal identification data—they express their consent for the processing of their personal data by UVT, in order to be periodically informed about the admission process, UVT's educational offer and services, and to allow UVT to interconnect with the Integrated Information System of Education in Romania (SIIR) for retrieving their personal data and results obtained in the Bacalaureate exam.

(4) The online registration process is finalized once the admission file is validated by the admission committee, following the verification of its completeness and correctness, and after the registration fee has been paid or the fee exemption has been validated by the faculty-level admission committee based on the supporting documents uploaded to the admission platform.

(5) Candidates must present all required documents for the admission process, in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, either in original or legalized copies, no later than one day before the publication date of the list of admitted candidates, as per the admission calendar outlined in Article 7. These documents must be submitted at UVT headquarters or at the county admission centers organized by UVT, for scanning and certification as true to the original by UVT operators. Candidates who do not comply with this paragraph will not be included in the admission ranking.

(6) By exception to paragraph (5), documents issued by public or private legal entities in electronic format, bearing a qualified or advanced electronic signature as defined in Article 3, points 11 and 12 of Regulation (EU) No. 910/2014, do not require certification as true to the original.

(7) After the registration period ends, the options selected, their order, and other information in the candidate's file registered on the online admission platform cannot be modified.

(8) Within a single submitted file, a candidate may select multiple options for bachelor's degree programs or types of places (e.g., tuition-free or fee-paying) they are interested in, indicating their priority order. After the rankings are generated, the candidate can be admitted to only one option from those selected in a single file, depending on their preferences, admission average, and the regulations provided by this document.

Article 9. Required Documents for Admission Registration

(1) The documents required for the admission file to the bachelor's degree programs within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology are as follows:

1. **Identity card / national ID**
2. **Birth certificate**
3. **Marriage certificate** – if applicable
4. **Baccalaureate diploma or an equivalent diploma**
 - Candidates who passed the baccalaureate exam during the sessions corresponding to the 2024–2025 school year may upload to the admission platform and present at the document submission points within UVT headquarters or in the county-level admission centers organized by UVT, for the admission session immediately following the session in which the baccalaureate exam was passed, instead of the diploma, a **certificate issued by the pre-university educational institution**, either in original or legalized copy, stating the **overall average** of the baccalaureate exam, **grades obtained** for each test, **validity period**, and the fact that the diploma has not yet been issued.
5. **Medical certificate** issued by the family doctor, **no older than 90 days** from the date of its submission, attesting whether the candidate is medically fit to enroll in university studies, and, if applicable, listing any **chronic conditions**

(neuropsychiatric, psychopathological, pulmonary, dermatovenerological, disabilities – type, degree, etc.).

- **Specific learning disorders** (dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, etc.) or any **special educational needs** must be certified by a **diagnostic certificate**.
6. **Certificate confirming attendance in another bachelor's degree program** (whether completed or not at the time of file submission), specifying the **funding status** (state-funded / tuition-based) for each year of study (if it was pursued at a public higher education institution in Romania), and, if applicable, the **years and semesters** in which the student received a **scholarship**, as well as the **type of scholarship**.
7. **English language proficiency certificate** – only for candidates applying to the English-taught bachelor's program **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences (in English)**.

The following certificates are recognized:

- International certificates (Cambridge: **Proficiency A, B, or C; Advanced A, B, or C; First A, B, or C; IELTS**: minimum score 6; **TOEFL**: minimum score 60);
- Certificate of studies in English for candidates who graduated from programs taught in English;
- Awards in national or international English language Olympiads, certified by the Ministry of Education (1st, 2nd, or 3rd place);

Candidates who do not hold an international English language proficiency certificate must attend the LIT Test organized by the Faculty of Letters, History and Theology of the West University of Timișoara, on the date scheduled according to the admission calendar. The admission test will be conducted in English, and the result will be equivalated for those candidates who also submitted an application for other programs within the faculty. The language proficiency test cannot be validated based on the language proficiency certificate obtained as part of the Romanian Baccalaureate examination.

(2) Romanian citizens or candidates from EU member states, the European Economic Area, and the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Withdrawal Agreement of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community 2019/C 384 I/01 (British citizens who are residing in Romania and continue to live on Romanian territory after the end of the transition period set in Article 126 of the agreement as

December 31, 2020, as well as their family members who accompany them or join them after the transition period, provided they held family member status before the transition ended, and children born or adopted after the transition period, on condition of presenting proof of registration issued by the General Inspectorate for Immigration under the Ministry of Internal Affairs), who have completed high school studies outside Romania, as well as those holding diplomas issued by educational organizations operating in Romania under a foreign curriculum, must submit, in addition to the previously mentioned documents, the document of recognition/equivalency of studies issued by the National Center for Recognition and Equivalency of Diplomas (CNRED). In the case of recognition documents issued online by specialized departments of the Ministry of Education and Research, they must be uploaded electronically on the admission platform by the candidate, within the deadline set for registration by the faculty's specific admission regulations, and do not require certification as true to the original by UVT operators. The required documents and the procedure for the recognition of studies completed outside Romania are detailed in Annex 2 of the Regulation of the West University of Timișoara regarding the organization and conduct of the admission process for bachelor's degree programs.

(3) The documents required for candidates applying for places allocated to Romanian citizens from everywhere (ethnic Romanians abroad) are specified in Annex 3 of the Regulation of the West University of Timișoara (UVT) regarding the organization and conduct of the admission process for bachelor's degree programs.

(4) Candidates eligible for exemption from the registration fee, according to Article 19 of this regulation, must also upload the supporting documents corresponding to the category they fall under to the admission platform.

(5) Candidates with outstanding results in national or international Olympiads and competitions may upload their supporting documents to the admission platform.

(6) For admission to bachelor's degree programs taught in Romanian, candidates who do not hold Romanian citizenship and who do not present Romanian-issued educational documents (diplomas and certificates) resulting from studies completed in Romanian, or educational records attesting to at least three consecutive years of study in Romanian, issued by educational institutions from the Romanian national system or abroad, are required to present a Romanian language proficiency certificate (minimum B1 level, according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). This certificate must be issued by: pre-

university education units organizing the Romanian language initiation course, accredited higher education institutions in Romania offering the Preparatory Year Program in Romanian for foreign citizens, Romanian language lectorates in foreign universities, the Romanian Language Institute, or the Romanian Cultural Institute.

(7) For students who took the Bacalaureate exam in Romania and attended high school in an international language or a minority language, the certification of Romanian language oral communication skills is done through the Bacalaureate diploma, issued by authorized/accredited educational institutions in Romania.

Article 10.

(1) For enrollment in bachelor's degree studies, candidates admitted to state-funded places are required to submit, at the document collection points located at the UVT headquarters or in the county admission centers organized by UVT (only during the periods in which these centers are open, according to the information published on the dedicated admission website – <https://admitere.uvt.ro/procesul-de-admitere/centre-judetene-de-admitere/>), their original bacalaureate diploma (or certificate, for candidates who passed the bacalaureate exam in the 2024–2025 session).

The deadline for submitting the original diploma/certificate coincides with the confirmation deadline corresponding to the confirmation stage in which the candidate also pays the enrollment fee, in accordance with the admission calendar specified in Article 7 of this regulation.

(2) If, following the process of confirmation and redistribution of places, a student initially declared admitted on a tuition-based place (which the student confirmed within the period established for that stage, as per the calendar in Article 7 of this regulation) is transferred to a state-funded place, they must submit the original bacalaureate diploma (or certificate, for those who passed the bacalaureate exam in the 2024–2025 session) within 2 working days from the moment the result is published on the online admission platform, but no later than: July 23, 2025, at 18:00 for the first admission session, or September 15, 2025, at 16:00 for the second admission session.

(3) Candidates admitted to state-funded places who, at the time of registration, submitted only the certificate mentioned in Article 9, paragraph (1), point 4 of this regulation, are required to submit the original baccalaureate diploma no later than September 29, 2025.

(4) Failure to present the original baccalaureate diploma, due exclusively to the candidate's fault, within the set deadline, will result in the loss of the state-funded place.

(5) Candidates who, at the time of submitting the original diploma, also possess the recognition certificate for the diploma (if applicable), are required to submit that certificate as well, in original, along with the diploma.

(6) In the case of recognition documents issued online by the specialized departments of the Ministry of Education and Research, these documents must be uploaded electronically on the admission platform by the candidate, within the deadline established for registration according to the faculty's specific regulations for the organization and conduct of the admission process of each faculty, and do not require submission in physical format or certification as true to the original by UVT operators.

Article 11. The Admission Contest/Tests

(1) Admission to bachelor's degree studies at the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology, regardless of the type of education, is based on a contest, according to the tests established by this regulation, for the purpose of evaluating competencies.

A. FIELD OF SOCIAL WORK

A1. Bachelor's degree study program in Social Work – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/programe-de-licenta-asistenta-sociala-zi/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

A2. Bachelor's degree study program in Social Work – distance learning format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/programe-de-licenta-asistenta-sociala-zi/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

B. FIELD OF PSYCHOLOGY

B1. Bachelor's degree study program in Psychology – full-time education format, in Romanian

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/psihologie-zi/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (60% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (40% of the admission grade).

Minimum criterion: The general average of the baccalaureate exam must be **equal to or greater than 7.00**. Files that do not meet this criterion will not be accepted.

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

B2. Bachelor's degree study program in Psychology – Cognitive Sciences (in English), full-time format, in English

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/psihologie-zi/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (60% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (40% of the admission grade).

Minimum criterion: The general average of the baccalaureate exam must be **equal to or greater than 7.00**. Files that do not meet this criterion will not be accepted.

Enrollment in this bachelor's degree program is conditional on possession of an English language certificate (minimum level B2), which may be demonstrated by:

- An international certification (e.g., Cambridge Proficiency A, B, or C; Advanced A, B, or C; First A, B, or C; IELTS: minimum 6 points; TOEFL: minimum 60 points);
- A distinction obtained at national or international Olympiads recognized by the Ministry of Education (1st, 2nd, or 3rd place);
- A certificate of graduation from English-taught studies.

Candidates who do not fall into one of the above categories may opt for the LIT Test, organized by the Faculty of Letters, History, Philosophy, and Theology at West University of Timișoara.

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

C. FIELD OF SOCIOLOGY

C1. Bachelor's degree study program in Sociology – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/programe-de-licenta-sociologie/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

C2. Bachelor's degree study program in Human Resources – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/programe-de-licenta-resurse-umane/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

D. FIELD OF EDUCATIONAL SCIENCES

D1. Bachelor's degree study program in Pedagogy – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/pedagogie/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

D2. Bachelor's degree study program in Pedagogy of Primary and Preschool Education – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/pipp/>)

Admission criteria:

1. Musical Aptitude Test – eliminatory;
2. Romanian Language Knowledge Test (spelling, punctuation, correct expression);
3. General average of the baccalaureate exam (used for ranking if the first two tests are passed).

Note: Only candidates who pass both eliminatory tests can be ranked.

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

D3. Bachelor's degree study program in Special Psychopedagogy – full-time education format

(The curriculum can be consulted at the address: <https://fsp.uvt.ro/psihopedagogie-speciala/>)

Admission criteria:

1. UVT test for assessing linguistic and reasoning abilities (50% of the admission grade);
2. General average of the baccalaureate exam (50% of the admission grade).

In the case of equal averages, the following tie-breaking criteria will apply:

1. The grade obtained in the written baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature;
2. The grade obtained in the written exam of the elective subject, depending on the profile/specialization of the high school, within the baccalaureate exam.

(1) The admission average for each candidate is calculated based on the admission criteria specific to the study program they applied for, according to Article 11.

(2) For each candidate, a single admission average will be calculated for the study program they applied for, according to the specific formula established by the faculty for that program:

a. For admission to study programs where the admission average results from the general baccalaureate average and the grade obtained in the UVT test, the formula is:

Admission average = (General baccalaureate average × percentage according to the program structure) + (UVT test grade × percentage according to the program structure)

b. For admission to study programs that require a minimum average (e.g., Psychology – minimum 7.00), the general baccalaureate average must meet or exceed this threshold in order for the candidate's file to be accepted.

c. For study programs that include eliminatory tests, candidates who do not pass these tests will not have an admission average calculated and will not be included in the ranking.

d. For candidates applying to multiple programs within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology, a separate admission average will be calculated for each selected study program, according to the specific structure of each.

e. The admission average is calculated with two decimals, without rounding.

Article 13.

In the case of equal admission averages for several candidates at the same study program, the tie-breaking criteria mentioned in Article 11 will be applied. If the tie persists after applying the first tie-breaking criterion, the next criterion will be applied. If equality is still maintained, all candidates with identical scores who cannot be enrolled in budget-funded places due to the limited number of available places will be declared admitted to tuition-based places, in accordance with the expressed options and the number of available places in the tuition-based format.

Article 14.

(1) Candidates for bachelor's degree studies who have obtained, during high school, **distinctions (1st, 2nd, or 3rd place) at international Olympiads** recognized by the **Ministry of Education and Research** and/or **1st place at national Olympiads** funded by the Ministry of Education and Research, have the **right to register without taking the admission competition** (except for eliminatory tests: the **musical aptitude test** for the **Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy** program and the **English language proficiency test** for the **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences** bachelor's program (in English)), for **state-funded places**.

(2) Candidates who have obtained **distinctions (2nd place, 3rd place, or honorable mention)** at **national Olympiads** organized by the Ministry of Education and Research will have their **admission average equated to the grade 10** for admission to bachelor's degree programs within the **Faculty of Sociology and Psychology** (subject to passing the eliminatory tests, where applicable: the **musical aptitude test** for the Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy program and the **English language proficiency test** for the Psychology – Cognitive Sciences program (in English)).

(3) Special conditions will also apply to candidates who obtained the following results in competitions organized by the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology:

- **1st place in the national contest “Education for the 21st Century”**, in both sections, obtained in the last **3 years**, will be **equated with grade 10** for admission to one of the following bachelor's degree programs: **Pedagogy, Special Psychopedagogy, or Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy** (subject to passing the eliminatory test **musical aptitude test**);
- **2nd and 3rd place** in the national contest “**Education for the 21st Century**” – an **additional point** added to the admission exam result;
- **1st place** in the national contest “**Skills for the 21st Century**” – **equating the admission average to grade 10** for one of the bachelor's degree programs in **Pedagogy or Special Psychopedagogy**;
- **Olympiad of Altruism – 2025 Edition, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places** – **equating the admission average to grade 10** for the bachelor's degree program in **Social Work – full-time education**.

Article 15.

(1) Candidates who have been **valedictorians (heads of class)** from **UVT partner high schools**, or who have obtained a **grade of 10** in the **Baccalaureate exam** (based on an **invitation letter signed by the Rector of UVT**, which must accompany the candidate's file), must take the **admission tests specific to the bachelor's degree program(s)** they apply to—**except** in cases where they have obtained **distinctions in national or international Olympiads/competitions** during high school and thus qualify for the **special conditions** related to the admission process as outlined in **Article 14** of this regulation.

(2) Candidates mentioned in paragraph (1) of this article are eligible for **tuition-free places**. If, following the admission competition, they are enrolled in a **tuition-paying place**, they will benefit from a **tuition fee exemption for the first academic year**, based on a **written request** submitted to the **Student InfoCenter** no later than the **end of the second week of the academic year**.

In this case, they will **not be required to pay the first installment of the tuition fee**, instead **uploading the received letter** in the **tuition fee payment section** of the digital admission platform, where it serves as a **supporting document for the exemption**.

Article 16. Admission Average

(1) The **minimum overall admission average** for bachelor's degree programs organized by UVT **cannot be lower than 6.00 (six)**, provided that **none of the grades obtained in the admission tests is lower than 5.00 (five)**.

A **grade of 7.00 (seven)** in the **Baccalaureate exam** is an **eligibility criterion** for the following bachelor's degree programs:

- a. **Psychology**
- b. **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences (in English)**
- c. **Special Psychopedagogy**
- d. **Pedagogy**

Article 16. Admission Average

(1) The **minimum overall admission average** for bachelor's degree programs organized by UVT **cannot be lower than 6.00 (six)**, provided that **no grade obtained in the admission tests is below 5.00 (five)**.

A **grade of 7.00 (seven)** in the **Baccalaureate exam** is a **mandatory eligibility requirement** for the following bachelor's degree programs:

- a. **Psychology**
- b. **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences (in English)**
- c. **Special Psychopedagogy**
- d. **Pedagogy**
- e. **Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy**

If the average is lower than 7.00, the application file **will not be validated** for these programs, but it **remains eligible** for the other bachelor's programs of the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology (**Sociology, Human Resources, Social Work – full-time, Social Work – distance learning**). If a student selects both eligible and ineligible options, the ineligible ones **will be deleted**.

(2) The **overall admission average (MA)** is calculated to **two decimal places**, without rounding, using the following formula:

MA = Admission Average

MB = Baccalaureate Average

T = UVT test of linguistic and reasoning abilities

L = Romanian language and orthography test (only for Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy)

- a. **Social Work (full-time):** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$
- b. **Social Work (distance learning):** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$
- c. **Psychology:** $MA = MB * 0.4 + T * 0.6$ (Baccalaureate average of 7 is mandatory)
- d. **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences (in English):** $MA = MB * 0.4 + T * 0.6$
(Baccalaureate average of 7 and English language proficiency are mandatory)
- e. **Sociology:** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$
- f. **Human Resources:** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$
- g. **Special Psychopedagogy:** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$ (Baccalaureate average of 7 is mandatory)
- h. **Pedagogy:** $MA = (MB + T) / 2$ (Baccalaureate average of 7 is mandatory)
- i. **Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy:** $MA = (MB + L) / 2$ (The musical aptitude test is graded as pass/fail; Baccalaureate average of 7 is mandatory)

(3) Candidates are ranked in **descending order of their admission averages**, within the **limits of the approved number of places** for each bachelor's program.

(4) The admission average or the general scores obtained by candidates are valid for **ranking purposes only within the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology**, according to this regulation.

5) The ranking resulting from the admission competition will also be used to allocate **state-funded places**, which will be awarded to the **highest-ranked eligible candidates**, for each bachelor's degree program.

In the case of **equal admission averages**, the following **tie-breaking criteria** will apply:

- Grade obtained in the **written Baccalaureate exam in Romanian Language and Literature**;
- Grade obtained in the **written exam of the elective subject**, based on the high school profile/specialization, as part of the Baccalaureate examination.

(6) For candidates in the category of **Romanians from everywhere (ethnic Romanians abroad)**, the admission average is calculated as:

MA = Baccalaureate exam average.

If the candidate graduated from a high school **without a Baccalaureate exam**, and the diploma is **recognized by the Ministry of Education and Research**, the admission average will be the **average of the years of study**.

The **conversion of qualifications or grades** from different grading systems will be made by the **faculty's admission committee**, based on existing recommendations.

In case of equal averages, the following **tie-breaking criteria** will be applied:

1. Grade in **Romanian Language and Literature**, or if such a grade is not available, the grade in the most **relevant Baccalaureate subject** for the specialization profile. The tie-breaking grade will be decided by the **admission committee**, based on the analysis of the documents submitted in the application file.
2. **Average of the years of study.**

For the **vocational program in Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy**, admission is **conditioned by participation** in the **vocational musical aptitude test**.

For the **Psychology – Cognitive Sciences** bachelor's program (taught in English), admission is **conditional on holding a language proficiency certificate**, in accordance with the provisions of this regulation.

Article 17. Submission of Appeals

(1) Any appeals related to the admission process may be submitted **within 24 hours** from the publication of the admission results, according to the admission calendar provided in **Article 7**, via the following email address: **admitere.fsp@e-uvt.ro**.

The appeals are analyzed by the **Appeals Resolution Committee**, established at the faculty level, and the **results of the appeals** are published **within a maximum of 24 hours** from the expiration of the appeal submission deadline, in accordance with the calendar presented in **Article 7**.

Appeals are not accepted for oral examinations, sports aptitude tests, or other **eliminary vocational tests**, or **artistic aptitude tests**. Appeals based on a **lack of knowledge of the admission regulation and/or current legislation** will not be accepted. The decision of the **Appeals Resolution Committee** is **final**.

(2) The **admission results** are made public by being posted on the **UVT website/admission platform**, in compliance with **data protection regulations** concerning personal information.

Article 18. Place Confirmation / Enrollment

(1) During the period set for confirming the places obtained in the admission competition, in accordance with **Article 7** of this regulation and **after the resolution of appeals**, the **enrollment of admitted candidates** is carried out.

(2) Candidates admitted to **state-funded places** must pay the **enrollment fee**.

(3) Candidates admitted to **tuition-paying places** must pay the **enrollment fee** and a **partial tuition fee (30% of the annual tuition cost)**.

(4) UVT signs a **university study contract** with each enrolled student.

(5) After enrollment, **final lists** with the names of the **admitted and enrolled candidates** will be generated and posted.

(6) By paying the enrollment fee, candidates acknowledge that they **have read and accepted the provisions** of the **university study contract for the academic year 2025–2026**, which will be published on the **UVT website** and on the **UVT admission platform** (www.admitere.uvt.ro).

(7) A candidate may be admitted and enrolled as a student in **no more than two university degree programs simultaneously**, regardless of the study cycle or the institutions offering them.

(8) A candidate **may benefit from state funding for only one bachelor's degree program**. If a candidate is admitted to **state-funded places in two bachelor's degree programs** belonging to the same study cycle, they must **choose** which program will be funded by the state, **no later than the confirmation deadline specified in Article 7** of this regulation. The candidate confirms the chosen place through the **admission platform** and **notifies by email the admission committee of the other faculty** about their withdrawal from the state-funded place obtained and, optionally, about their intention to occupy a **tuition-paying place**, which must then also be confirmed.

(9) A candidate who has completed a bachelor's degree program in a state-funded place may only pursue another bachelor's degree program **as a tuition-paying student**.

A candidate who has partially pursued a bachelor's program with **state funding** may benefit from a state-funded place in a new bachelor's degree program **only for the number of academic years not previously completed with state funding** in another program from the same level of university studies.

(10) The **costs for exceeding the normal duration** of a state-funded university program, as provided by law, shall be covered by the student.

(11) After the confirmation periods have ended, if there are candidates declared admitted who **have not confirmed their place** by paying the **enrollment fee**, new ranked lists will be published. These will result from the **reordering** of candidates with **lower admission averages** onto the **remaining available places**, depending on the order of options selected in their online admission application file.

When preparing the new ranking(s), the faculty will also consider those candidates who, due to **selecting a limited number of options**, were not included in the initial ranking and thus were **not admitted** to any place they could confirm. However, based on their **admission average**, they qualify for one of the **available places** left after the confirmation process. Candidates who were initially admitted to **lower-priority options** but later become eligible for **higher-priority options** in subsequent ranking iterations will be declared **admitted to the highest-priority option** in their original list for which they qualify.

Article 19. Admission Process Fees

(1) At the **Faculty of Sociology and Psychology**, the **application fee** for the bachelor's degree admission competition is **200 RON**, and the **enrollment fee** is **250 RON**, in accordance with the decisions of the **UVT Senate**.

The **application fee** is paid **once per faculty**, regardless of how many bachelor's degree programs the candidate applies to **within that same faculty**.

If the candidate applies to and wishes to pursue **two degree programs simultaneously** at UVT, they must submit **a separate application** on the admission platform for each program and pay the **enrollment fee** for each of them.

These fees are publicly available on the website of the **West University of Timișoara**.

(2) **Categories of candidates exempt from paying the application fee** for the admission process to undergraduate university studies, based on supporting documents uploaded to the online admission platform, are:

- Pupils who, during their high school studies, obtained **distinctions (1st, 2nd, or 3rd place)** at **international school Olympiads** recognized by the Ministry of Education and Research and/or **distinctions (1st, 2nd, 3rd place or honorable mention)** at national Olympiads or competitions **organized or funded by the Ministry of Education and Research**;
- Pupils who, during high school, earned **distinctions at the following national competitions**:
 - National Contest "Education for the 21st Century", **1st place**, in both sections, **obtained in the last 3 years**;
 - National Contest "Skills for the 21st Century", **1st place**;
 - Altruism Olympiad – 2025 Edition, **1st, 2nd, and 3rd place**;
- Pupils who have the status of **valedictorians (șefi de promoție)** from **UVT partner high schools**, or who obtained a **10.00 average at the baccalaureate exam** (based on an **invitation letter** signed by the **Rector of UVT**, which must accompany the candidate's file);

- **Children of all staff** (teaching, auxiliary teaching, and non-teaching personnel) in the **pre-university education system**, whether **currently employed or retired**;
- **Children of all staff** (teaching, auxiliary teaching, non-teaching personnel, and staff from central university libraries) in the **university education system**, whether **currently employed or retired**;
- **All employees** in the **higher education system** and **central university libraries**;
- Candidates with **one or both deceased parents**, as well as those from **single-parent families**.

The following candidates are also **exempt from paying the admission application fee**:

- **Candidates from foster care centers / the child protection system**;
- Candidates at **risk of losing the ability to meet their daily living needs** due to:
 - **Medical conditions** (proven by a medical certificate confirming a chronic illness);
 - **Disability** (proven by an appropriate certificate);
 - **Poverty**, demonstrated by:
 - Having received **social scholarships in the final year of high school** (for candidates graduating in the current year),
 - Or other **supporting documents** showing financial assistance from the Romanian state, as evaluated by the **faculty-level admissions committee**;
- **High-performing athletes** (members of CSU-UVT, clubs and sports divisions that have **collaboration agreements with UVT**, and **medalists at national, European, or world competitions**, proposed by the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport).

(3) Categories of candidates exempt from paying the registration/enrollment fee for undergraduate studies:

- Pupils who, during high school, obtained **distinctions (1st, 2nd, or 3rd place)** at **international Olympiads** recognized by the **Ministry of Education and Research**

and/or **distinctions (1st, 2nd, 3rd, or honorable mention)** at **national Olympiads or competitions** organized or funded by the Ministry;

- Pupils who earned distinctions in other **national or international competitions**, such as:
 - "Education for the 21st Century" National Contest, **1st place**, in both sections, obtained in the last 3 years;
 - "Skills for the 21st Century" National Contest, **1st place**;
 - Altruism Olympiad – 2025 Edition, **1st, 2nd, and 3rd places**;
- Pupils who are **valedictorians** (șefi de promoție) of **UVT partner high schools** or who obtained a **10.00 average at the baccalaureate exam** (based on an **invitation letter signed by the UVT Rector**, which must accompany the application);
- **High-performing athletes** (members of **CSU-UVT**, athletes from clubs and sports divisions with collaboration agreements with UVT, **medalists at national, European, and world competitions**, upon proposal of the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport).

4) Exemption from the payment of these fees is granted **only based on supporting documents** uploaded by candidates on the online admission platform and presented **in original** at the designated document submission points within the UVT headquarters or at the **county admission centers** organized by UVT.

Invitation letters issued by the Rector of UVT for candidates with outstanding results **do not require certification as originals** via scanning at UVT's document submission points. Approval of the exemption is granted by the **faculty-level Admission Committee**, through validation on the online admission platform.

(5) Candidates from **non-EU countries**, the **European Economic Area**, and the **Swiss Confederation** must pay an **admission application fee of 100 euros** (for file processing in preparation for admission).

(6) Upon **confirmation of the place** obtained following the admission competition, in accordance with the admission calendar outlined in Article 7 of this regulation, **admitted candidates must pay the registration fee**.

(7) By **July 23, 2025** (for the July admission session) or **September 15, 2025** (for the September admission session), students **admitted to fee-based undergraduate programs** are required to pay **30% of the annual tuition fee**. Failure to make this payment within the established deadline will result in the **loss of the allocated place**.

Article 20

(1) At the **Faculty of Sociology and Psychology**, an **Admission Committee** is established, responsible for the **proper organization and conduct of the admission process** at faculty level, as well as an **Appeals Committee**, both approved by the Faculty Council.

(2) The **Admission Committee** at the faculty level consists of:

- the **Vice-Dean** responsible for **academic programs and quality management**,
- **teaching/research staff and PhD students** from each department (responsible for application validation and supervision),
- and **teaching staff** (responsible for the evaluation of test papers).

The number of teaching staff members included in the committee is based on the ratio of **1 teaching staff per 50 students** of the maximum enrollment capacity:

- Social Work – 4 teaching staff
- Psychology – 6 teaching staff
- Sociology – 4 teaching staff
- Education Sciences – 5 teaching staff

The number of evaluators will be determined based on the number of **unique candidates** participating in the UVT Test, with a ratio of **1 evaluator per 30 candidates**.

(3) Duties of the Admission Committee members include:

- a) Participation in training sessions;
- b) Communication with candidates;
- c) Verification and validation of application files submitted on the platform;
- d) Final verification of files and publication of results;
- e) Verification and approval of fee exemptions, in accordance with the university's admission

regulations;

f) Supervision during the exam;

g) Evaluation of exam papers (tests).

(4) The **Appeals Committee** at the faculty level is composed of:

- the **Dean** of the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology,
- the **Vice-Dean** responsible for student relations, international relations, and administrative issues,
- and the **Program Coordinator** for the respective undergraduate study program.

(5) The responsibilities of the Appeals Committee include:

a) Reviewing the appeals;

b) Resolving the appeals;

c) Communicating the outcomes of the appeals to the candidates.

Article 21

This regulation, as well as the **UVT Regulation on the organization and conduct of the admission process** for undergraduate study programs, is **binding** both for the Faculty Admission Committee and for the candidates.

It is made known to them through publication on the **website of the Faculty of Sociology and Psychology** and on the **UVT admission portal** – www.admitere.uvt.ro.

Article 22

The **Faculty of Sociology and Psychology shall not be held responsible** for:

- registration or calculation errors in official documents required from candidates during the admission process (diplomas, academic transcripts);
- errors made by candidates while completing the application form on the online admission platform;
- failure of the candidate to finalize the admission application on the online platform (after paying the registration fee/uploading supporting documents for fee exemption)

through the online platform, the application file must still be finalized and submitted; **payment of the registration fee does not equate to submission of the file).**

Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy

Candidates applying for the Bachelor's degree program in Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy will take an aptitude test, which is eliminatory:

- **Musical aptitude: (musical hearing, rhythm, performance of a song chosen by the candidate)**

Each candidate will receive a pass or fail grade, which cannot be contested.

Candidates who pass will then take the Romanian language proficiency test (focused on elements of spelling and punctuation).

NOTE: Graduates of Pedagogical High Schools or National Pedagogical Colleges who took this musical aptitude test at the time of admission to high school will be exempt from retaking it, provided they submit a certificate from the respective educational institution confirming this.

Candidates who fail this musical aptitude test may choose to apply for another Bachelor's degree program within the Education Sciences field (such as Pedagogy or Special Psychopedagogy).

**ROMANIAN LANGUAGE KNOWLEDGE ASSESSMENT TEST
(SPELLING, PUNCTUATION AND CORRECT EXPRESSION)**

for the **Bachelor's Degree Program in Primary and Preschool Education Pedagogy**

The purpose of the **Romanian language knowledge assessment test** (spelling, punctuation, and correct expression) is to evaluate candidates' understanding of the main rules of **Romanian spelling, punctuation, and proper usage**, in accordance with the normative references of the Romanian language.

The test focuses on evaluating the understanding and analysis of the use of spelling and punctuation marks in various sentence structures, as well as identifying/correcting expressions that do not conform to current Romanian language norms.

The test will consist of **36 items**, each graded with **0.25 points**. **One point is awarded by default.**

The **maximum score** that can be achieved on this test is **10 (ten)**.

The **minimum passing score** is **5 (five)**.

Time allowed to complete the test: 60 minutes.

Sample items:

1. The correct use of the homonym is in the sentence:

- a) Nu știi cine v-a spus acest lucru.
- b) Oare cine v-a putea afla adevărul?
- c) Va întristat această veste.

Correct answer: a)

2. In the sentence: O TRIMIT LUI ION CARE MIA CERUTO DAR ȘI ORICUI ÎȘI EXPRIMĂ DORINȚA DE A O CITI, the spelling and punctuation marks missing are, in order:

- a) comma, hyphen, hyphen, dash, comma, period;
- b) comma, hyphen, hyphen, period;

c) comma, hyphen, hyphen, comma, period.

Correct answer: c)

3. The sentence with the correct spelling of "niciun" is:

a) Îmi pare rău că nu am niciun frate, nici o soră.

b) Îmi pare rău că nu am nici un frate, nici o soră.

c) Îmi pare rău că nu este prezent niciun copil.

Correct answer: a)

4. The incorrectly written sentence is:

a) Nu cred că vroia să ne însoțească.

b) Nu zice întotdeauna adevărul!

c) De obicei, creează opere remarcabile.

Correct answer: a)

(Note: "vroia" is considered incorrect; the correct form is "voia".)

5. The incorrect plural form of the noun arbitru appears in the sentence:

a) Acești arbitri au fost foarte vigilenți.

b) Arbitrii au ezitat în luarea deciziei finale.

c) Cei doi arbitrii au sancționat sportivul.

Correct answer: c)

("arbitrii" in c) is used incorrectly with the definite article.)

6. The correctly written sentence is:

a) Am stat de vorbă cu copiii aceia.

b) Nu fii zgârcit când nu trebuie.

c) Foile aceleleași cărți s-au înegrit.

Correct answer: a)

7. The homonym is written incorrectly in the sentence:

a) Nu i-au cunoscut pe acei studenți.

b) Până să i-a o decizie, se consultă cu familia.

c) Va trebui să îl ia și pe prietenul său cu mașina.

Correct answer: b)

("i-a" should be "ia" — the verb, not the pronoun + auxiliary.)

8. The incorrectly written sentence is:

- a) Aveau o bună cunoștiință la Pitești.
- b) Era un celebru om de știință.
- c) Trebuia să aprofundeze aceste cunoștințe.

Correct answer: a)

("cunoștiință" is misspelled; the correct form is "cunoștință".)
